

How can I ensure the school gets the funding?

The more eligible children that are registered for free school meals, the more funding the school receives. Registering does not mean your child has to take up free school meals if they don't want to.

You should still register for free school meals even if:

- Your child already receives universal infant free school meals
- You would rather your child had a different meal, such as a packed lunch

Pupil Premium and Free School Meals

If your child qualifies, the school can receive funding to support your child's progress and achievement within school.



Which children qualify for free school meals?

Your child may be eligible for free school meals if you receive any of the following:

- Income support
- Income based job seekers allowance or Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (as long as you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on
- Universal Credit.

PARENTS RECEIVING WORKING TAX CREDIT ARE NOT ELIGIBLE

In addition, schools must provide free school meals to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. This is known as universal infant free school meals.

What are the benefits of claiming free school meals?

School meals are a good way to ensure that your child eats well at lunchtime, and they can also save you time and about £400 a year!



Alongside the hot school meal, the children have access to the very popular salad bar.

What is pupil premium funding?

The pupil premium grant is funding provided to schools to help all children reach their full potential, regardless of their background or financial situation.

Pupils may be eligible if they:

- are registered for free school meals
- have been registered for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years.
- are, or have been, in care
- have parents in the armed forces.

How is the pupil premium funding used?
