Deliberate choices:	<u>Reading</u> We have chosen the RWI scheme to teach early reading as it is a rigorous, systematic scheme with proven results. <u>Writing</u> Deliberate text choices for each genre, in each year group is highlighted in yellow. Term 2 - all children creating instructions for a purpose that is linked to Christmas. Some are linked with art/DT topics Term 3 - to develop T4W strategies across the school, each year group has been allocated a Pie Corbett Story to use as their model text Term 6 - across the school, all Non-Chronological reports are linked to another area of learning to make purposeful cross curricular links Some historical concepts are linked with previous history topics to deepen the children's understanding of events during that time period (eg:King Arthur Y3 Term 5 to link with time period of Romans/Anglo-Saxons)
