WHAT ARE THE CHILDREN LEARNING ABOUT THIS WEEK?

This week in Team Magic:

As writers, the children have been learning about the past and present, comparing different types of transport and discussing how they have changed. They also enjoyed making Easter cards and are writing a recount of our fantastic Adventure Play trip, using time connectives to sequence the events clearly.

As Mathematicians, we explored 3D shapes, learning their names and properties through hands-on play. The children investigated which shapes roll, stack, or slide and used the shapes to print using paint and playdough. We have also been discussing where you would find 3D shapes in the environment and what they might be used for.

Across provision, the children have been busy jumping, climbing, building, and mark-making, showing wonderful creativity and physical confidence. On our trip, they demonstrated amazing bravery, independence, resilience, and enthusiasm.

This week in Team Believe:

In Team Believe, the children have had a fantastic Spring Term and participated in lots of amazing events such as Number Day, World Book Day, Science Week, Red Nose Day and even a visit from a great athlete, Lesley Owusu. This term, we have been working on consolidating our learning and showing what we now know.

Next term, we will explore a range of engaging topics across the curriculum. As writers, we will focus on the narrative genre, developing storytelling skills through character creation, setting descriptions, and structured plots. As Mathematicians, we will build our understanding of place value, to read, write, and compare numbers with increasing confidence. In PSHE, we will be learning about relationships, including how to build positive connections, show respect, and understand the feelings of others. In PE, we will create movement inspired by animals, using our bodies to explore balance, coordination, and expression.

We are looking forward to a fun and productive term ahead in Team Believe!

This week in Team Inspire:

As mathematicians, the Owls have been developing their understanding of measurement. We have been exploring how to measure volume, capacity, length and mass.

As writers, we have been focusing on descriptive poetry. The children have drawn upon their knowledge of figurative language and imagery to complete their 'hot task'. They have worked hard to include powerful adjectives, similes, and other creative techniques to paint vivid pictures for the reader, producing some imaginative and engaging pieces of writing.

As scientists, we have been investigating how shadows are formed and how they change. The children have really enjoyed carrying out practical experiments, making predictions and observing how shadows vary depending on the position of a light source.

This term, the children have also thoroughly enjoyed their swimming lessons, building confidence and developing important water skills. In addition, we had a wonderful trip to St Peter's to watch *Beauty and the Beast*, which was a fantastic experience for everyone.

In Deer Class, the children have shown great focus and dedication while completing their assessments. They have consolidated their learning and clearly illustrated their understanding. They have planned and written their final pieces of descriptive poems, where they have included poetic features such as metaphors and similes; interesting vocabulary, precise and powerful verbs and adverbials.

Optional homework: Maths & English packs have gone home with the children.

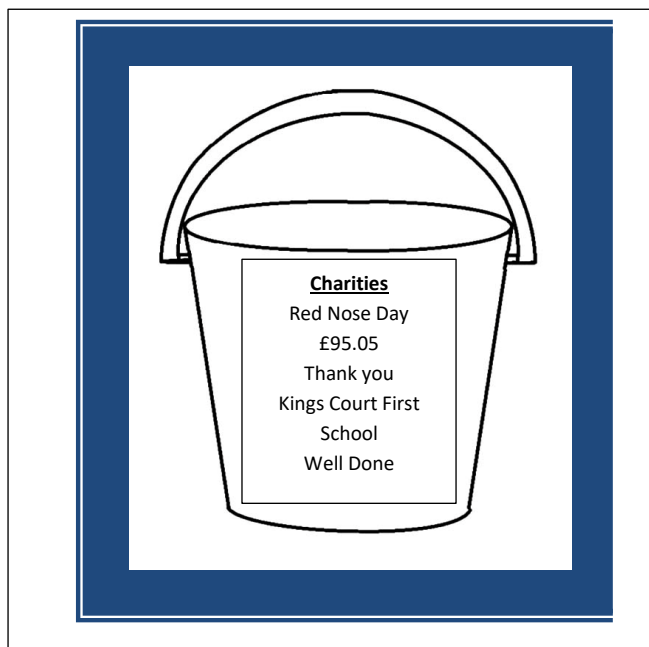


