WHAT ARE THE CHILDREN LEARNING ABOUT THIS WEEK?

This week in Team Magic:

We were exceptionally proud of Robins for their very first performance in front of mummies and daddies! Not only were they super behaved, they also performed beautifully – Happy Harvest! In Phonics the children have finished the Set 1 Sounds and have consolidated their previous learning of these. Next week the children will move onto learning about diagraphs (two letters and one sound), we call this their 'Special Friends'. The children have thoroughly enjoyed learning about story maps and the children have used their imagination to change story characters and the outcomes – this was so much fun and enjoyed by children and adults alike! In maths, the children have been finding and looking at various representations of 1, 2,3 and subitising. As the children showed such competence and confidence, they are now working with numbers to five. In continuous provision the children have learnt about Changes over Time, improved their fine motor skills and been rather creative exploring the outdoor area by digging and minibeast hunting!

This week in Team Believe:

The children have shown teamwork and enthusiasm as they have put together such a wonderful Harvest Festival assembly.

In Squirrel class as mathematicians, we have started to consolidate previous learning on number bonds to ten and applying them to solve problems to twenty. As writers the children have fully embraced poetry this term as illustrated in their final piece – using the repetition language 'Once upon a time...' in their poetry. As geographers we have investigated aerial views of our local area and using this information to identify and label areas in our school.

In Hedgehogs, as writers the children have produced their final piece of work to consolidate their poetry learning this term. They have each created a rhyming sentence to show their understanding. The children have focused on number bonds to ten and applied this knowledge to answer questions within ten. As scientists they have shown their understanding of the changes of the autumn season via illustrations and labels.

This week in Team Inspire:

The children in Owl and Deer Class have worked incredibly hard for the past few weeks to put together their wonderful Harvest Assembly – we hope you enjoyed it as much as we did. We had a huge amount of parent turnout – thank you so much for taking the time to support your child at this special time of year.

In Owl class in maths we have been working on addition and subtraction skills – adding and subtracting one ten and hundred from a number. Next week we will explore other different methods of adding and subtracting. In English, the children have produced a final poetry (Haiku and Cinquain) about autumn – some masterpieces! In Science, the children have thoroughly enjoyed learning all about the animal skeletal system, including humans.

In Deer, the English focus has been generating and planning Autumn list poems. A walk-in nature, really inspired the children to generate list poems using adjectives, similes and onomatopoeia. Maths, has been a variety of topics within place value – which the children needed to further master. This has really helped to build their confidence and enhance mathematical skills. In science, the children have illustrated such engagement as they have learnt all about teeth!

Dear Parents and Carers,

Re: Unsafe Parking Outside School Premises

As a valued part of our community, King's Court is committed to fostering a safe and respectful environment for all—our students, families, staff, and local residents.

We are writing to address a concern raised this morning regarding unsafe parking outside the school during drop-off time. This behaviour poses significant safety risks to children and other road users, and has unfortunately led to unnecessary tension within our community.

We kindly remind all parents and visitors to observe the following guidelines to help maintain a safe and harmonious environment:

Parking Etiquette

- Please park only in designated areas.
- Avoid blocking driveways, access roads, or pedestrian crossings.
- Do not park on pavements, as this obstructs safe passage for pedestrians, especially children and those with mobility needs.
- Parking on yellow zig-zag lines outside the school is illegal at all times. Rule 243 of the Highway Code prohibits parking in areas that pose safety risks, including bends, dropped kerbs, and the brow of hills.

Respectful Communication

We ask everyone to engage courteously with school staff, other parents, and local residents. Aggressive or confrontational behaviour will not be tolerated and may be reported to the appropriate authorities.

Patience and Understanding

Drop-off and pick-up times can be busy. Your patience and cooperation are essential in ensuring a safe and orderly environment for all.

We are actively working on solutions to improve traffic flow and parking arrangements around the school. This includes inviting our local community warden to monitor the area during peak times.

To support these efforts:

- We will begin documenting instances of illegal parking, including photographs of vehicles (make, model, and registration).
- These will be shared with the community warden for further action.

Let's work together to keep our children safe and maintain positive relationships with our neighbours.



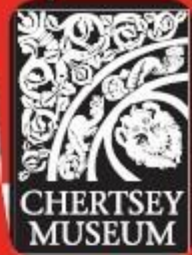

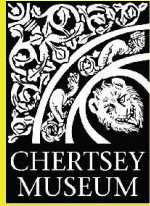
