WHAT ARE THE CHILDREN LEARNING ABOUT THIS WEEK?

This week in Team Magic:

In mathematics the children have investigated weight by comparing objects around the class using vocabulary such as heavier, lighter and equals. They have immensely enjoyed this learning as it was very practical and child-led!

As early writers the children have been forming letters through air writing. Additionally, in phonics continuous sound spotting has taken place throughout the week in the class. Robins have had a rather energetic outdoor learning experience and they showed super engagement as galactic explorers in their P.E lesson!

This week in Team Believe:

In Hedgehogs we have focused on sentence structure with a strategy called colourful semantics (breaking up a sentence and colour coding it). The children have worked on using a number line in order to find different place values. As scientists we have investigated why leaves have changed Colour in autumn. Scientific vocabulary such as energy transfer and chlorophyll have been used. As artists we have explored different aspects of portraits, for example Leonardo da Vinci.

In Squirrels we have been creating a dance using movement related to the environment – in small groups and performing in front of an audience. As writers the children have continued to use text maps to write poetry inspired by what they have read and they have used their own personalities to innovate their poems. As mathematicians, we have focused on place value and sensibly estimating where numbers belong on a numberline. As scientists the class have continued their learning about habitats – with a focus on micro - habitats and what animals they may find inside.

This week in Team Inspire:

As writers Owls have been developing our poetic language using similes, noun phrases and adverbials. These techniques will lead into planning for writing their own pieces about Autumn. As mathematicians, we have consolidated place – value by ordering, comparing and partitioning numbers. In science, we have investigated food groups and nutrition and have learnt about planning a balanced meal with this knowledge.

In Deer class the children have thoroughly enjoyed their poetry journey and have drafted some impressive Kennings poems. As mathematicians the children have been challenged with applying their Roman Numeral knowledge! The children have also learnt to round numbers to ten, hundred and thousand – they very much persevered!

As scientists the children have started learning about the human digestive system – they brought lots of knowledge to the lesson!

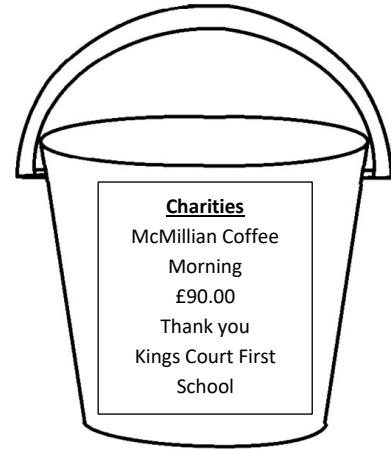
