WHAT ARE THE CHILDREN LEARNING ABOUT THIS WEEK?

This week in Team Magic:

We have been reading the story 'Billy and the dragon' following on from St George's day last week where we read 'George and the dragon.' In phonics we have been working hard to consolidate our knowledge of special friends and using them to read and write words. In math's we have been doubling the numbers 1-5 and identifying odd and even numbers. We have now moved on to exploring 3D shapes and learning about the shapes and number of their faces. Next week during outdoor learning we will be searching for 3D shapes in the environment and looking at more complex patterns.

This week in Team Believe:

This week in Year 1, as mathematicians we have counted in 2's, 5's and 10's and started making equal groups. As readers we have looked at narrative fictional texts by many authors such as Dick King Smith, Roald Dahl and Michael Morpurgo. As geographers, we have been exploring physical and human features of Australia.

This week in Year 2, as writers we been exploring Anthony Browne and the characters in his books. We have been bringing the characters to life using descriptive language in our writing. As mathematicians we have been investigating fractions and equal parts of a whole. We've used songs and physical resources to help us with our learning about fractions. As scientists we have planted beans and predicted the outcome of our investigation. As artists we have familiarized ourselves with the work of Andy Goldworthy and practiced making our own natural sculpture.

This week in Team Inspire:

In Year 3 as mathematicians we have continued our learning of fractions. We consolidated our knowledge about adding and subtracting fractions. As writers we have been focusing on the text 'King Arthur.' We produced our own Arthurian dictionaries where the children were asked to used 'knightly' words. As scientists we have started our topic on rocks. The children were excited to see all the different types of rocks. As artists we have produced observational drawings of Salvador Dali's artwork. The children did well with their interpretations.

This week in Year 4 we have started our learning on 'How to train your dragon.' We studied the opening and how this gives you information. As mathematicians we have finished our work on decimals. We looked at how to apply this to our learning. As scientists we have started our topic on fossils. We have looked at fossil making and what paleontology is.

Communication Systems at King's Court First School

During the course of the academic year if you have a concern or would like to meet to discuss anything regarding the Home-School Partnership or for any queries you have, our whole school communication system is:

1. Class Teachers

Please bring any worries or concerns directly to the class teacher. Briefly catch your child's class teacher at drop off and pick up, or use one of the communication methods listed; Class Dojo message, arrange for a phone call or a meeting. This can be arranged via the school office. Alternatively, you can send an email directly to the school office for the attention of (class teacher name).

2. Senior Leader

If you have been in contact with the class teacher and there are still outstanding concerns you can contact the senior leadership team via the school office. Please send an email for the attention of (senior leader name) or arrange for a phone call or meeting. There are, at times, queries which may need to be addressed by a senior member of staff.

3. Head Teacher

We appreciate there can be queries or concerns that may not directly fit into the communication system above. On those occasions an email for the attention of the head teacher can be sent directly to the school office.

All members of staff endeavour to reply to any messages within 5 working days.

Please see a reminder of our family responsibility, as agreed within the Home School Agreement, to:

Treat school staff, governors, and other parents/children with courtesy and respect at all times, raising any issues of concern with the school in the first instance.

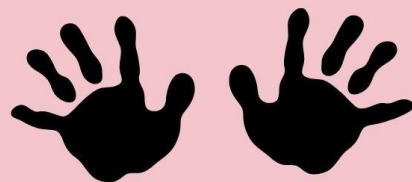
