WHAT ARE THE CHILDREN LEARNING ABOUT THIS WEEK?

This week in Team Magic:

In Team Magic this week the children have been working hard in their new phonics groups, revisiting Set 2 sounds and applying these in their reading. Robins have also been completing a morning task where they write a sentence based on a picture prompt, helping them practise and apply their newly learned sounds independently.

In maths, we have been consolidating our understanding and composition of numbers to 20 and beyond through a range of practical activities and games. We are working on counting beyond 20 to 30 and practicing counting backwards too.

In our topic work, we recreated a map of our classroom using mixed media and have been practising road safety skills in preparation for our trip to St Peter's next week.

In PE Robins are working hard to refine their skills on the balance bikes. We will be building up confidence to hopefully move around different objects and obstacles.

The children have been making the most of the warmer weather, spending lots of time outdoors. They have especially enjoyed making mud pies and creating potions in the water tray!

This week in Team Believe:

Team Believe thoroughly enjoyed their school trip to Winchester this week. The WOW moment of the day was when the children watched the show in the planetarium.

As Writers, Hedgehog class have been exploring various examples of non-chronological reports. They have been identifying the key features of a non-chronological report which includes a title, sub-heading, pictures and factual information. Next week, the children will be writing sentences using factual information for their reports.

As Mathematicians, Hedgehogs have been exploring the number of tens and ones using base ten in a given number up to 100. Next week, the children will build on this knowledge finding one less and one more of a given number up to 100.

As Writers, Squirrel class have been researching and recoding interesting facts about dinosaurs. Next week, the children will continue to record this information in relevant sections using subtitles to organise their information accordingly. As Mathematicians, Squirrels have started to explore tally charts and tables to identify and record their findings. Next week, the children will be investigating pictograms including a key to represent the groups.

This week in Team Inspire:

In Owl class this week the children have been looking at features of non-chronological reports and they have thoroughly enjoyed researching everything about King Henry VIII and have produced the first writing draft - a great start! As mathematicians the children have been looking at identifying and comparing different types of angles.

As scientists the focus has been forces and the children have investigated what happens when force is applied to different objects. They particularly enjoyed investigating friction of different surfaces!

In Deer class the children have consolidated their knowledge of time and have shown good understanding and a positive learning attitude. In English they have applied their knowledge of narrative writing and are working towards completing an exciting story independently.

For the next few weeks, the children are going to be incredibly busy rehearsing their Leavers Performance - You are Special! Children have received the lyrics to all the songs – please do encourage them to learn the words and actions/dance movements that accompany them.

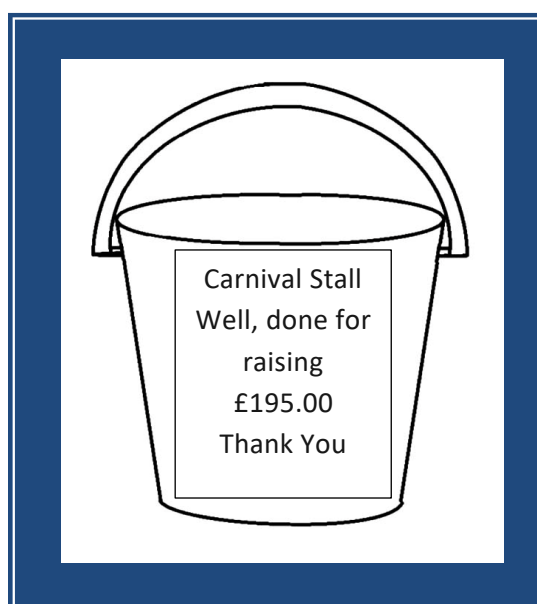
